### Employment Authorization for International Student Candidates

International students seeking employment in the United States should consult with Office of International Programs (OIP) to learn about the employment benefits related to their status and to request assistance in obtaining employment authorization.

There are various types of employment benefits, including On-Campus Employment, Curricular Practical Training (CPT), and Optional Practical Training (OPT) –each with specific eligibility requirements and application procedures.
